Services for Organizations

Public Awareness

Our AT Tryout Center provides free informational displays and equipment demonstrations for outreach events such as open houses, support group meetings, and professional meetings or conferences.

Group Training

These workshops are designed to increase knowledge, skills, and competencies regarding AT. They may target a category of equipment or target an individual device and may relate to specific disabilities or environments. This is a fee-based service.
